Open Ended Questions to get a relationship started. Used on a one-on-one situation between a church member and a Young Adult/Student.

1. Tell me what you are studying? Tell me about your job?
2. Who is your favorite professor and why?
3. Tell me about some of your co-workers, what are they like?
4. What do you think you will do after college? What do you think you will do with your degree?
5. Where did you grow-up?
6. What was pleasant about growing up there? What did you not like?
7. Tell me about your family. What did your father do for a living, your mother?
8. How many siblings do you have? What is/was your relationship to them?
9. Did you know your grandparents? What were they like? Any great stories from their past?
10. Were you close to your Aunts and Uncles? Cousins? Which side of the family did you like best and why?
11. What was high school like for you? Any stories?
12. Did you vacation as a family? What was your favorite and why?
13. Did you have summer jobs while in school? What did you like, dislike about them/it?
14. Did your family go to church? What type? What did you like or dislike about going to church?
15. Was there a youth group at the church? What did you like or dislike about the youth group?
16. In which areas of theology do you struggle?
17. Any special area we should hone in on?
